Dear St Paul of the Cross Parishioners,

Last week I saw a news story that really moved me. Mary Daniel, 57, took a part-time job as a dishwasher at RoseCastle in Jacksonville, FL, not because she needed the money. Her husband of many years was at that facility and this was the only way she could see him. After scrubbing dishes and mopping floors, she can steal a few precious hours with her husband, Steve, who has Alzheimer's. "It didn't matter what I had to do to get there," said Mary. "I was willing to do whatever it took to fulfill my promise that I was going to be there for him every step of the way."

Many people who read the story were genuinely touched. We have seen such acts of kindness during this pandemic. This story was, of course, towards a spouse, a member of one's own family. We have also witnessed extraordinary acts of kindness that strangers have done for others.

Early in this strange period I remember hearing a story of a landlord in Queens, NY. He owned a hundred apartments, I believe. He informed all his tenants that he was not asking for rent for that month. When an interviewer asked him if he would incur a huge financial hit, he replied, "Human life is far more precious than money." Then he led that reporter into his office where the walls were lined with pictures of the Sacred Heart and the Blessed Mother. Pointing to them, he proudly announced, "I do this because of my Catholic Faith."

I am quite certain that you have come across stories like these – stories of human kindness that involve strangers and friends. We all feel so much better about this difficult time when we witness such powerful manifestations of real humanity. Unfortunately we have seen also the opposite. There have been examples of horrible inhumanity. Some individuals have been so unkind, and even so cruel, that certain memes have begun to circulate online.

Even in our church we have seen such unkindness. It takes many, many volunteers to enable us to have Mass and celebrate the Sacraments. Many parishioners have stepped forward, spent hours training and are sacrificing themselves so that their fellow parishioners can receive the Lord in their parish church. And yet, some of our volunteers have been treated poorly. In the same way, we have formulated guidelines for weddings, baptisms and funerals consistent with what the archdiocese requires of us. Our parish staff as well as our volunteers have been sometimes subjected to harsh comments, angry put downs, and even outright unchristian behavior.

There seems to be so much anger in our society right now. It seems to be bubbling right beneath the surface. It is waiting to burst out. Maybe people are unkind because we have been cooped up for more than three months with no end in sight. People seem to be at the breaking point. They do not know where to direct their frustration and anger. During these incredibly challenging times, all of us need to remind ourselves that this too shall pass. We need to put our trust in the Lord Who is watching over us. More than ever, we are called to be kind to one another at this time.

Kindness is the sweet expression of love. In his well-known hymn to love, St Paul says, "Love is patient; love is kind." Kindness is exuding goodness towards others, no matter who they are or what they have done for us. In his Letter to the Ephesians, Paul encourages his Christians to imitate Christ Who laid down His life for us. He writes: "Put away from you all bitterness and wrath and anger and wrangling and slander, together with all malice, and be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ has forgiven you. Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God."

At many of the funerals that I have celebrated almost everyone eulogizes the deceased not for their great achievements. They consistently point out how kind they were. Even sons and daughters remember their parents not so much for how much they gave them. They appreciate their deceased fathers and mothers for the way they loved them. We will be remembered for our kindness. Dr Albert Schweitzer, who knows a thing or two about loving his neighbor, said these memorable words: "Constant kindness can accomplish much. As the sun makes ice melt, kindness causes misunderstanding, mistrust, and hostility to evaporate."

What the world needs more of today are not successful individuals. The world needs more kind people. May the God Who is always tender and kind infuse kindness into our hearts!

A Note from the Ushers

A lot has changes since our Church has reopened. It is imperative that we practice social distancing for the safety of all. We ask for your patience and understanding. In order to attend Mass please sign in via SignUpGenius or contact the Rectory Office at 847-825-7605. Mass sign up will closed upon capacity or 24 hours prior to the service.

Please come early. Sign in and doors will close shortly after Mass begins. At this point there will be no more admittance. Please follow the instructions from our greeters who will sign you in, take your temperature, offer you hand sanitizer and see if you would like a mask.

Masks are required to attend all Masses.

Ushers will seat you according to the size of your party. Once seated, please remain in that seat until the end of Mass. Due to pre-assignment of the seating you may not be able to sit in any area you would like to.

As per the guidelines of the archdiocese, everyone is to keep the mask on at all times, covering both mouth and nose, for the entire Service. Please follow the ushers' instructions for Communion as well as for exiting the Church at the end of Mass while staying approximately 6 feet apart.

Washrooms will not be available during the Mass. In case of an emergency, exceptions will be made. Please ask an Usher.

Please remember to keep your mask on and maintain social distancing should you have conversations with others outside the Church after Mass.

Please try not to linger in the parking lot.

A SHARE IN GOD'S KINGDOM

Today concludes a three-week series of Gospel texts in which we have listened to a total of seven parables about the Kingdom. The believer is asked to consider the request that God made of Solomon in today's first reading: "Ask something of me and I will give it to you" (1 Kings 3:5). Today's parables about the treasure buried in the field and the pearl of great price should prompt us to answer, "A share in your kingdom, O God!" Today we discover that the kingdom of God is beyond value, a priceless treasure. Unfortunately, our culture bombards us with things that it believes are priceless treasures—the bigger and better SUVs, anti-aging and anti-balding creams and salves, miracle diets, and so much more. Having a share in God's kingdom and helping to bring about that kingdom are the greatest treasures that we can ever hope to gain.

SAINT MARTHA (first century)

July 29

Whether you find Martha Stewart admirable or annoying, she has the perfect patron saint. Luke describes Martha—saint, not Stewart—as "burdened with much serving" (Luke 10:40). About Mary, seated, listening to Jesus, Martha complained, "Do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving?" Jesus' response, "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things . . . Mary has chosen the better part" (10:41, 42), suggests to some the superiority of the contemplative life, leaving the rest of us, supporting families, earning livings, (helping others?), as second-class Christians. But Luke introduces Martha and Mary immediately after Jesus' parable of the Good Samaritan, whom Jesus recommends as a model of practical compassion, concluding, "Go and do likewise" (10:37). Go and do! Sit and listen! Discipleship is never either/or but both/and. Jesus ministered in prayerful silence and hospitable service. Monastic calendars add Martha's sister, Mary, and brother, Lazarus, calling all three "hosts of the Lord," recalling their welcome of Jesus to their home in Bethany, reminding us Whom we welcome whenever we extend summertime hospitality!

Mission Appeal — Daughters of Mary-Tabora, Tanzania



Sr. Sophia Mbihije, CDMT, belongs to the Religious Congregation of the Daughters of Mary-Tabora, Tanzania. Currently, she is the Dean-Faculty of Education and Director of Post Graduate Studies at Archbishop Mihayo University College of Tabora -Tanzania. Sister Sophia will be sharing with us the work of the Daughters of Mary. Sister thanks you for the opportunity to share with you about the Daughters of Mary-Tabora and their ministries in Tanzania.

The Daughters of Mary-Tabora (CDMT) is a Diocesan Religious Congregation of women. The charism of the Congregation is love and service. Each member of the community engages in a variety of different activities such as health care, education, pastoral ministry, social work, and the development of women and youth in 8 Dioceses in Tanzania.

“Their Needs”

The effect of HIV in Tanzania has led to a great number of orphans and homeless children within the country. As part of relief services, the Daughters of Mary established an elementary school and dispensary in the remote rural areas. The education related to psychological, intellectual, physical, spiritual therapy, and healthcare, is offered to the orphan and homeless children, and other people in the areas we minister. The orphans need not only attention in areas of food, shelter, clothing, and teaching facilities, but also more classrooms as a result of an increase of orphans.

Education and healthcare services are particularly directed to rural areas where we serve poor nomadic people and orphans in the rural areas of Tanzania. For example, our community has clinics among those most in need in rural Mission areas. Due to the high concentration of poor people in those areas, the clinics are not meeting the needs of the people. Patients must walk a distance between 20-30 miles to reach the clinics. Expectant mothers often deliver their babies on the way to the clinic, and some patients lose their lives before arriving at the clinics because of the lack of transportation. Even after arriving, patients are forced to share one bed, and some sleep on the floor due to the shortage of beds. We have an urgent need for medical equipment and an ambulance.




DO WE REFUSE TO HEAR GOD'S VOICE IN THE STORM?


