Parish Gradually Reopening

Dear St Paul of the Cross Parishioners,

Thank you for your patience. We are finally ready to reopen. We were given the go ahead two weeks ago but it has taken us all this time to get everything ready. I am grateful to my Leadership Team and our maintenance crew who have worked tirelessly for this project.

Here are the details:

- We started with confessions on Saturday, 6/6, at 3 pm for 1 hour. Only 10 persons can be in the church at any given time. The overflow should stand outside and not enter the church until the greeter lets them in. Please know that bathrooms are not available during confessions. Penitents are expected to fulfill their penance at home. We will have confessions again on Wednesdays from 8 to 9 am. If you need assistance and would like to come for confession, please call the office one day prior and please leave a message. Someone will get back to you.
- On Sunday, 6/7, we had three hours for private prayer from 9 am to noon (with 10 persons in church for 20 minutes slots). Bathrooms are not available during private prayer time.
- Starting on Monday, 6/8, parishioners can reserve slots for baptisms and funerals. Please contact our parish office. So far no funerals or baptisms have been scheduled. Right now we are not scheduling new baptisms; we are catching up with baptisms postponed since March.
- From next week this will be the schedule:

The archdiocese is allowing parishes to move into Phase II once they have done prayer and sacraments a few times. Now that we have learnt from our experience, we are ready to apply for the next phase. Once we obtain that certification we can have Mass for 50 people at first and then slowly increase the number. We will start with weekday Masses and then move on to offering Sunday Masses. We will update you as things change.

We will have a video on our website which will explain in detail how we will do things in this phase. There will be volunteers present at all events – private prayer, confessions and other sacraments to help you. To reserve a spot for private prayer please go to signupgenius.com. Reservations are mandatory and masks must be worn at all times. If you have questions or find it difficult to sign up, please call our parish office at 847-825-7605. We will continue to celebrate Mass on weekdays and put the video on our website. On Saturdays we will continue live stream our Mass at 4:30 pm. I am hoping and praying that everything will go smoothly. Please continue to pray that we can all be together soon to celebrate the Eucharist as a parish family. God bless you!

Dear St Paul of the Cross Parishioners,

I wonder if Jesus is coming back soon. We are living through some unsettling times. With a pandemic that is ravaging the world and the country that is in turmoil, some people are wondering whether the end times are near. Believe me, I do not believe in spreading fear because of what is happening around us. And yet, this unprecedented time in the history of the world and also of our country asks me whether the time is ripe for Jesus to return.

I have often wondered how I would react to Jesus if He came back. How would I respond to the challenges that Jesus issued to his contemporaries? Would I follow Him as did His disciples? Would I be willing and ready to lay down my life for Him as so many saints and martyrs have done down the centuries? Or, would I have walked away because his teachings were too hard to accept?

As we are celebrating Corpus Christi this Sunday, my mind goes to the story of Jesus multiplying the loaves and fish. The evangelist dedicates a whole chapter to the Lord's discourse on the Bread of Life. Jesus tells His disciples that He is the Bread of Life, and that unless they eat His body and drink His blood, they will not have life in them. Some of His listeners no longer walk with Him; they leave His side. Then Jesus looks at the faithful ones and asks, almost with disappointment in His voice, "Would you also go away?" Jesus does not water down His teaching; He does not sugarcoat His serious claim that He gives His very body and blood for our nourishment.

The Master addresses the same questions to each one of us: "Will you go away from Me? What are my teachings that you find hard to accept? Are you prepared to walk with Me even to the heights of Calvary?" What words of Christ do I find hard to accept? What words shake my determination and undermine my commitment?

Jesus said, "I am the Bread of life. Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you shall not have life in you." Are these words hard to accept? Do I firmly believe in the Real Presence? Or, do I rather look at the Eucharist merely as a fellowship meal that mourns the death of a friend?

Jesus said, "Unless a grain of wheat dies, it remains a single grain. But if it dies, it produces much fruit. He who saves his life will lose it. He who loses his life for my sake will keep it for everlasting life. Take up your cross and follow me. What does it profit a man if he gains the whole world but suffers the loss of his soul?" Are these words hard to accept?

Jesus said, "No one can serve two Masters. You cannot serve God and money. Where your treasure is, there your heart will be. If you will be perfect, sell all you have and give it to the poor. Then come and follow me. It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the Kingdom of God." How do I react to those words?

Jesus said, "Do not worry about tomorrow. Look at the birds of the air and the lilies of the field. They do not reap or spin. Yet your Heavenly Father takes care of them. Will He not take care of you? Seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness and all these things will be added unto you." Are these words hard to live by?

Jesus said, "Blessed are the peace-makers for they will be called children of God. Love those who hate you. Pray for those who hurt you and calumniate you. If they strike you on one cheek, show them the other." Is Jesus asking too much?

Jesus said, "Do not judge and you will not be judged! Why do you look at the speck in your brother's eye and you have a plank in your own. The measure you use to measure against others will be used to measure against you. Be compassionate as your Heavenly Father is compassionate." Do you think that Jesus is too unrealistic?

Jesus said, "How often should you forgive your brother? Not once, not twice. Not seven times, but seventy times seven. If your Father forgives you without question, should you not forgive those who hurt you?" Are these words too hard to accept?

Jesus said, "Blessed are the pure of heart for they shall see God. What comes out of a man's heart is what makes him unclean. If a man looks at a woman with lust in his heart, he has committed adultery." Is Jesus out of touch with the real world?

Jesus said, "The Son of Man has come not to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for the many. You have seen me wash your feet. You must now wash each other's feet. If you want to be the first, you should be the last. You should be the servant of all." Am I ready to live by these words?

Will you say that these are hard sayings? Will you leave his side? Or, with Peter, will you declare, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life"?

To be a true follower of Jesus is not easy. Let us pray that God will give us the grace to rise up to the challenge.

Last Saturday, our parish distributed bags of groceries to 171 households curbside, to respect the current social distancing directive. Each household received 4 prepacked bags filled with soup, meals in a can, tuna, canned vegetables and fruit, cold cereal, cake or brownie mix, peanut butter and jelly, pasta and pasta sauce, instant side dishes, mac n cheese, toilet paper, paper towels, snacks and more. They were also given a pound of frozen hamburger purchased by our **Mother Teresa Guild** and meals donated by **City BBQ in town**.

Prepacking over 700 bags takes a small army of dedicated volunteers. **Lisa Muench, our new Food Pantry Coordinator**, has spear headed the effort since March, when we needed to change our distribution to curbside. Together, with her husband Don, sons, Kyle and Tyler, and mission driven friends she makes it all happen. Last but not least, a word of thanks to Frank Dopek, who always shows up to lend a hand. I thank them for all their hearts of service.

The pandemic has affected so many lives, especially of those who are food insecure. They struggle even more to feed their families. We could not serve them without your donations of food and funds. Many of you are at risk and unable to go into the store to shop. Your monetary support and notes of kindness have meant more than you can ever know to me, and to all whom we serve. Thank you for your continued and strong support. These are very trying times. I take great comfort in knowing that we stand together in this parish and work to build the Kingdom.

CARDINAL BLASE CUPICH STATEMENT ON THE MURDER OF GEORGE FLOYD AND ITS AFTERMATH

Released May 31, 2020

The past nights I have watched in great personal pain as the pent-up anger of our people caught fire across our country. I saw the city where I was born, the cities where I have lived, the city I pastor now, catch embers from the city where I was educated and burn. Was I horrified at the violence? Yes. But was I surprised? No.

As the saying goes, if you're not outraged, you're not paying attention. What did we expect when we learned that in Minneapolis, a city often hailed as a model of inclusivity, the price of a black life is a counterfeit twenty-dollar bill? When we added another name to the list of those murdered for being black or for caring about the marginalized?

I will not pretend to speak with any authority about the challenges people of color experience in our society. I do not share the fear they put on when they and their children leave their homes every day. I do not know what it means to be "other." But I know there is a way to fix it. And the fix begins when we stop talking about the proportionality of "their" response and start talking about the proportionality of "ours." Surely a nation that could put a man in space, his safety assured by the brilliance of black women, can create a fair legal system, equitable education and employment opportunities and ready access to health care. Laws do not solve problems, but they create a system where racism in all its forms is punished and playing fields are leveled.

The COVID-19 pandemic has been called a great equalizer. It has been even more a great revealer of societal cancers as deadly as the virus. As others have pointed out, health insecurity kills, and poverty is poison. We can and must make a society that views the soaring of a child's potential with more joy than the soaring of a rocket.

I stand ready to join religious, civic, labor and business leaders in coming together to launch a new effort to bring about recovery and reconciliation in our city. We do not need a study of the causes and effects. Those answers can be found on the shelves of government offices and academic institutions across our burning nation. No, we need to take up the hard work of healing the deep wound that has afflicted our people since the first slave ships docked on this continent. And we need to start today.

PERPETUAL EUCHARISTIC ADORATION CHAPEL

**SOLEMNITY OF THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST****FIFTEENTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ADORATION CHAPEL**

Today we celebrate the **Solemnity of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Christ**. In the Gospel of St. John, Chapter 6, we read of Jesus telling a crowd at the synagogue of Capernaum, **“In all truth I tell you, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink My blood, You have no life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink My blood has eternal life.** Many of His followers found His language repugnant and went away.


When Jesus broke bread with the Apostles at the Last Supper, He held the bread and said, **“This is My Body.”** Holding the cup of wine, He said, **“This is My blood.”** Then He commanded them, **“Do this in memory of Me.”** This is the command that directs priests at Mass to change bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ.

Today is also the Fifteenth Anniversary of our Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration Chapel. Each year we have celebrated the anniversary of our Chapel with a public procession from the Church to the Chapel. However, the pandemic has caused us to cancel that this year.

Our Chapel has served us well. It is a spiritual source for the success of our parish. We have estimated that since it was established, it has seen about 750,000 visits by Catholics and non-Catholics. Of all the visitors to the Chapel, it is the Committed Adorers, those who have agreed to cover the same hour each week, that has created the strong base for the Chapel’s existence. Praying before the exposed Body and Blood of Our Savior, in the serenity of the Chapel, enhances an adorer’s intimate relationship with Jesus. He invites all to be there, with Him.

FOOD FROM HEAVEN

God sustained the people of Israel for forty years in the desert with manna sent down from heaven, and Moses doesn't want them to forget it. God brought forth water from stone for them to drink, and Moses doesn't want them to forget this, either. And Moses tells them—twice—that the food that God sent was a food that neither they nor their ancestors before them had ever experienced before.

Jesus too speaks of food come down from heaven, food that the Jewish people had never experienced before. Recalling the manna in the desert, Jesus doesn't want them to forget it either, explaining that he is the food and drink of eternal life. And Paul reiterates to the Corinthians and to all of us that in the bread and in the cup, we share in the body and blood of Christ.




The following evening, SPC held the first-ever Drive-In Graduation that honored our graduates all while keeping to the social distancing guidelines.

Mary, friend and mother to all, through your Son, God has found a way to unite himself to every human being, called to be one people, sisters and brothers to each other.


We ask for your help in calling on your Son, seeking forgiveness for the times when we have failed to love and respect one another.
