A LETTER FROM OUR PASTOR, FR. BRITTO BERCHMANS



Dear St Paul of the Cross Parishioners,

During Lent and especially on Good Friday we are reminded that we adore a “Crucified King.” Even though He is the King of Kings and Lord of Lords, He is mocked, tortured and finally crucified. He does not fit our image of what a king should be. And yet, the Church continually celebrates the Feast of Christ the King on the last Sunday of the liturgical year.

The feast of Christ the King was established by Pope Pius XI in 1925 after World War I because the people had “thrust Jesus Christ and his holy law out of their lives” and “these had no place in public affairs or in politics.” The Pope went on to claim “that as long as individuals and states refused to submit to the rule of the Savior, there would be no really hopeful prospect of a lasting peace among nations.” Nearly a hundred years later, the situation isn’t very different today. We are still at war with our world. God seems to be edged out of the public and private lives of individuals. As Catholics, we are often at odds with our government and with the secular society.

This Carpenter from Nazareth declared to Pilate: “Yes, I am a king but my kingdom is not of this world.” In another place He said, “The Son of Man came not to be served but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for many.” He washed the feet of His disciples. Ultimately, He laid down His life for His subjects unlike our earthly rulers who compel their subjects to lay down their lives for them.

During the numerous funeral Masses that I have celebrated, I have sat through many eulogies – some of them brilliant, some of them moving and inspiring, and a few not very memorable. I always smile when the eulogist proudly asserts that the deceased lived their life on their own terms. To add punch to their assertion, the speaker would quote Sinatra and say that the deceased did it “My way!”

Unfortunately, the secret of wisdom, the key to true spiritual life and holiness, calls for the opposite. ***We can’t do it our way. We have to do it His way.*** In his masterpiece, The Divine Comedy, Dante paves the road to serenity with these words: “Your will is my peace!” It is in seeking our own will that we bring misery upon ourselves. To be our King’s true subjects, we must let His will be done and His Kingdom come into our lives. When He becomes the King and center of our hearts, then we will owe allegiance to Him alone.

As we look at our lives we should ask ourselves, “Who holds dominion over our minds and hearts? Who influences our judgments? Whose guidance do we seek in our day-to-day decisions and dilemmas?” For the first four centuries, thousands of Christians refused to submit to the demands of the divine Caesar and preferred to lay down their lives in allegiance to Christ the King. For almost twelve centuries, the Western nations sought to live their lives embracing the Christian vision of life. Even after the period of Renaissance and Enlightenment, people turned to philosophers and thinkers to guide them in their moral and personal lives. The Christian approach to life was dominant in people’s consciousness and in the minds of people in power. Let us not forget that our nation was founded on Judeo-Christian ideals and principles. Until the last fifty years or so, the dominant voices in our society belonged to the Church, the school system, the family, and the community. And these voices spoke more or less in unison as they reinforced similar values.

Today, the situation is totally different. Movie actors and actresses, singers and musicians, media talking heads, and fashion models have claimed the position of storytellers and guides. They tell us how to think, what to think about, how to live, and what ideals to strive for. They define how to succeed in this world and how to get there. They claim to know what it means to be a man or a woman. As they remain silent about what lies beyond this life, they ignore fundamental questions about our ultimate destiny. On our part, we have gifted our time and attention to mindless media channels and their power over us grows stronger by the day.

In order to accept Christ as our King, we must open the doors of our hearts and welcome Him completely into our lives. His sway over us cannot be contained within the one hour we spend in church on Sunday. His vision must permeate our everyday decisions and desires. His life and sacrifice must enlighten our path. Martin Sheen, who returned to His Catholic Faith in later years, said these significant words:

Religion, if it’s real, can’t be a sometime thing. It can’t be a Sunday thing... Martin Luther King said the church is the place to go forth from. Even his fellow preachers said, “Hey, man, what are you doing in the streets?” He said we’ve got to take what we believe into the streets.

Let Jesus Christ be our King! Let us live our lives for Him Who laid down His life for us! Let Him be our guiding force and our ultimate concern! He will then be our eternal destiny and our final reward!

A LETTER FROM OUR GREETERS AND USHERS

March 2, 2021

Dear St. Paul of the Cross Parishioners,

“To lose patience is to lose the battle.” This pandemic is lasting way longer than anyone could have ever imagined. With Easter coming up, we are asking you once again to please be patient and understanding with the procedures to keep everyone safe while attending one of our Masses.

Mass Registration

In order to attend Mass, please sign in via [SignUpGenius](#) or contact the Rectory Office at 847-825-7605. Mass sign up will close when the capacity is filled or 24 hours prior to the service.

Arrival

Please come early when attending Mass. Registration and doors will close shortly after Mass begins. At that point, there will be no more admittance. Please follow the instructions from our greeters who will sign you in, take your temperature, offer you hand sanitizer, and provide a mask if you do not have one. Masks are required and need to be worn at all times to attend the Masses.

Seating

Ushers will seat you according to the size of your party. In order to comply with social distancing guidelines, please remain in that seat until the end of Mass. Due to pre-assignment of the seating, you may not be able to sit in an area you would like to, but we do try our best to tend to your wishes.

During Mass

As per the guidelines of the Archdiocese, everyone is to keep their mask on at all times, covering both mouth and nose, for the entire service. Please follow the ushers' instructions for Communion. Everyone is to step up for Communion. If you do not wish to receive the Blessed Sacrament, cross your arms to receive a blessing instead, but it is important that you step out of the pew and follow the procession so that no one has to step over you.

Washrooms

Washrooms are not available. In case of an emergency, exceptions will be made. Please ask an usher.

Departure

In order to maintain social distancing when exiting the church, please remain in your seats until your pew is released by an usher. Follow the ushers' instructions for exiting the church while staying approximately 6 feet apart. St. Mary's side is going to be released first because they are closer to the doors being used to exit. Keep your mask on and maintain social distancing should you have conversations with others outside the Church after Mass. Try not to linger in the parking lot.

FR. BRITTO'S DREAM COMES TRUE!

One of Fr. Britto's visions for our parish has been to build a new facility for the food pantry. Father has always had a heart for the poor. He understands how important it is that our parish continue to feed the hungry. You can see by the pictures below that his dream has become our reality. Thank you Fr. Britto for remembering the least of our brothers and sisters, and for supporting our outreach to the poor in this generous way.

The new building at the end of the alley will become our new food pantry after the Covid restrictions are lifted. At that time, we will move the food from the current location to the new building. Our clients will again be able to physically go through the pantry and choose their own food with the assistance of our volunteers.

A year ago, my assistant, **Lisa Muench**, accepted the challenge and together we turned our distribution into the current curbside model. There were a lot of logistics and many moving parts to consider, and many more volunteers were needed to support the new method. Lisa managed the day-to-day details and kept us on track. She never gave up through all the twists and turns. I am grateful for her energy, organizational and people skills, strong work ethic, and heartfelt dedication.

Currently packed grocery bags are being stored on shelves ready for our curbside distribution at the end of each month. We continue to provide 4 bags of groceries for 200 food insecure clients who look to our parish for a little help. We give them enough food for a week, which is a huge help especially for the families with children. We could not do this without all the food and monetary donations that have steadily come in through the pandemic. So many of you signed up to help. Thankfully, Mother Teresa and St. Ann Guilds continued to perform their weekly pantry tasks, along with the strong and steady support from Don Sitkiewicz.



Below is a letter we recently received from Conchita, a mother of two girls, community activist and a Purépecha leader. Conchita shown in the photo above dressed in her traditional, colorful garb. She has lived in the North Shore community for over seven years.

Good afternoon ladies and gentlemen of St. Paul of the Cross Parish and School. I speak to you on this day to thank you for your beautiful congregation, I will love to tell you that you are the godparents of our churches and holy mother. I wish to be able to be there in person to be able to thank you all with a big hug.

I dare to write this letter asking you if it is possible to make our dreams come true, the dream of everyone who lives here in North Shore and around us. We have dreamed of being able to have our own church of God and our Holy Mother to be able to celebrate all the sacraments that God has asked us to complete. However, our dream became stronger after Father Francisco Valdovinos and the missionaries from Guadalajara (Sr. Maria Teresa and Sr. Aida) started bringing us the sacrament of the Holy Eucharist to our community. That was when we realized that we were missing a house of God in our community.

There have been times when our senior citizens, children under 1 years old, and others were unable to attend because of the weather. Sometimes when we celebrate the holy sacraments the weather was at 120°F hot and 30°F cold. The people are happy but at the same time they are sad because we wish to be able to celebrate these sacraments without having to worry about the weather stopping us from celebrating. We also see the necessities of other things; we do not have any chairs or if we do have chairs, we do not have any space to store them. There was a time where we would ask the community to bring their own chairs and they said, "Yes we will, we will bring our own chairs so nothing will be able to stop us from receiving the holy Eucharist." Thanks to the help of the Sisters we are starting to realize that we need a Church in this area. We need a place of God here so we can pray. – Conchita

NO PALM SUNDAY BLOOD DRIVE


Due to the pandemic, there will **NOT** be a blood drive at St. Paul of the Cross on Palm Sunday.






YEAR OF ST. JOSEPH INDULGENCES

GRANTED BY THE HOLY SEE FROM DECEMBER 8, 2020 TO DECEMBER 8, 2021

Below is a summary of how you can receive the special indulgences granted by the Holy See for the Year of St. Joseph. The plenary indulgence is granted under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion, and prayer according to the intentions of the Holy Father) to the faithful who, with a spirit detached from any sin, participate in the Year of Saint Joseph on the occasions and in the manner indicated by this Apostolic Penitentiary:

- Meditate for at least 30 minutes on the Our Father
- Participate in a spiritual retreat of at least one day that includes a meditation on Saint Joseph
- Perform a corporal or spiritual work of mercy
- Recite the Holy Rosary in families and between the husband and wife
- Entrust their work daily to the protection of Saint Joseph and to all believers who invoke with their prayers the intercession of the worker of Nazareth
- Pray the litany of Saint Joseph (for the Latin tradition), or some other prayer to Saint Joseph, typical of the other liturgical traditions, for the persecuted Church and for the relief of all persecuted Christians
- Pray any lawfully approved prayer or act of piety in honor of Saint Joseph, especially on:
 - * March 19th (Solemnity of St. Joseph)
 - * May 1st (Feast of St. Joseph the Worker)
 - * December 26th (Feast of the Holy Family)
 - * The Sunday of Saint Joseph (according to the Byzantine tradition)
 - * The 19th day of every month
 - * Every Wednesday (a day dedicated to the memory of the Saint according to the Latin tradition)


ABUSE OF JESUS AND THE CROWNING OF THORNS

On this fifth Sunday of Lent, we look at the Passion event that so closely resembles what we humans do every day to Jesus, the Son of God. We abuse Him with our sins.

After Jesus was scourged at the pillar, Pilate turned Him over to his soldiers. Jesus suffered harsh abuse and insults at their hands. They punched Him, spit on Him, ridiculed Him by covering Him in a purple cloak and placed on His head a crown of thorns, then chiding Him with fake adulation as “King of the Jews.” This is so symbolic of what we do to Him in our daily lives. This Jesus, who endured these days of suffering for our salvation, loves us more than we can imagine and yet, we offend Him constantly. We hear, but ignore, His message of love, His efforts to guide us through the pitfalls of our lives, and His teachings of the conduct we should follow to do the will of God. We succumb to our selfishness, our weakened will, and the illicit pleasures that arise and sometimes, push Him out of our lives altogether.

In apparition after apparition, the Blessed Mother constantly advocates that we make reparations to Jesus for the sins of man in order to save potentially lost souls from hell. She is asking us to remove the abuse that Jesus suffered in His Passion at the hands of the soldiers, the people, and also, our offenses.

Jesus said to St. Faustina, “**The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to My mercy**” (*Diary 723*). We pray for the forgiveness that Jesus in His mercy can offer and for the strength to live His will. We pray to atone for the sins of all mankind and to achieve a willingness to stop abusing Our Lord.
