Letter from a Pastor to his People

Dear Parishioners,

This image I recently came across is titled “The Coronation of the Virgin with Six Angels.” It was painted by Agnolo Gaddi in 1390 and is currently held in the National Gallery of Art in Washington DC. Though the feast of Mary’s coronation is in August, it’s a fitting image to pray with during this month of May – think of May crowning – and with these readings.



Jesus’ tenderness to his mother is what is most striking. With great care and attention he places the crown atop Mary. His only concern is ensuring Mary receives her glory. Mary’s glory doesn’t take away from Christ’s – his crown is slightly above Mary’s – but adds to his own. When a parent’s son or daughter succeeds, the parent is not threatened, but enhanced.

One author writes, “In Mary, tradition has always seen an image of the Church and so the coronation of Mary can be seen as the care of Christ, the ‘principal father,’ for each of his children.”

When Christ crowns Mary, the Mother of the Church, he crowns each of us. And that is why the Coronation of Mary is a nice image to reflect upon with our readings, which focus on the giving of the Holy Spirit. “My Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him” (John 14:23).

The Holy Spirit dwelling in us is our glory, and the Father’s glory too. With the Holy Spirit we are able to “face” God and talk to him, which is what authentic prayer is. We are able to be a source of grace to others.

Our excerpt from the Book of Revelation gives the beautiful image of the city in heaven that has no temple, nor sun or moon. The souls in heaven provide the light, and their light is from the glory of God.

Jesus can be with all of us at once and he can provide all the light necessary, but he chooses to use Mary and he chooses to use us. Mary can be with us, and comfort

us. We can be with each other, and comfort each other. This adds to Jesus’ glory.

I was always more amazed by the Easter bunny than by Santa Claus. Both are able to appear to millions of people at once – clearly a miracle. But Santa Claus had helpers in his elves and reindeer. The Easter bunny was by himself. Impressive feat to get all those Cadbury cream eggs and Reese’s Peanut Butter eggs (my favorite) out to all those Easter baskets.

Jesus is not a one-man operation like the Easter bunny. He uses Mary, the angels and saints, and us on earth. He crowns us. He gives us the Holy Spirit and makes us all Easter bunnies!

FOR GREATER GLORY

As the Easter season draws to a close, I think it is important to take a look at the Liturgical Calendar to see where we have been and where we are headed. Easter has been a time of great celebration. CHRIST IS RISEN! The Church gives us this time to bask in the light of the Resurrection for 50 days, to soak in the weight of God's glory in the victory of His Son over sin and death. What a gift!

However, when these days of festivity are over, we will return to Ordinary Time. This season falls in the midst of the excitement of summer when many of us are eager to get out and live for ourselves a little after the bleak cold of winter and the rains of spring have subsided. Yet, lurking within this season is the subtle and powerful temptation to shirk the weight of glory, to free ourselves from such a burden and return to those cheap things that so often occupy our attention. Brothers and sisters, we must fight this pull of the Enemy with every fiber of our being.

There is no doubt that this is a daunting challenge, perilous even. And make no mistake friends, it ends in death for each and every one of us. To bear the weight of glory, to live as a Christian disciple of Jesus Christ, means to share His yoke and bear His burden. We each are called to carry our Cross unto death like Jesus, to die to ourselves by putting to death our lives of sin in which we settle for those cheap and lesser goods because we believe the lie that we are not made for greater glory. So, as we enter into Ordinary Time and summer, let us bear witness to the glory that comes from a selfless death, from choosing to follow Our Father in Heaven and not the selfish whims of the world.

This summer I will be away in Guatemala studying Spanish for 8 weeks, so please pray for me and be assured of my prayers for you!

Baby Eveline was the very first Baptism I had the privilege to perform after my ordination in 2002. Now, 20 years and approximately 592 Baptisms later, I can still state that, of all the ministries Kathy and I participate in, Baptisms are still my favorite.

Simply put, I love Baptisms. Everything about them: the happy families, the "joyful noise" of the babies, the water, the prayers, the oils on my fingers. I love it all. Someone once described the clergy's role at Baptisms as "the minister of the threshold." The font is the threshold and we invite and welcome every family to share more fully in a life with Christ.

Baptism reflects our Church at its best: history, tradition, symbolism, rituals, prayers of praise and thanksgiving. There is so much happening there that we require new parents to attend a Baptism Preparation class.

Each Baptism is a public profession of what we believe. In fact, after eliciting the Profession of Faith from the participants, the celebrant proclaims one of the most beautiful, and overlooked, declarations in all the sacraments: "This is our faith. This is the faith of the Church. We are proud to profess it in Christ Jesus our Lord."

I consider each Baptism I celebrate an investment in the future of the Church. I often tell parents that Baptism is like a Catholic "Trust Fund." But a trust fund only grows if you continue to put into it. Baptism begins the parents' obligation of teaching their children to know, love and serve God and love their neighbor as themselves. Baptism is a sacrament of faith but the faith required is not a perfect and mature faith but only a beginning of a life-long relationship with Christ.

I am proud to be part of a long line of "Baptizers" throughout the centuries, standing at the threshold of the font, holding a towel and a shell and offering a blessing of welcome.
