

Letter from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

I have a vivid memory of my dad waking me up as a child very early one morning. That almost never happened. Something was wrong. I was eight years old. It was 1993. My dad came to my bedside, gently shook me awake, and, in a very serious and somber tone said, "James, Michael Jordan

retired."

I look back on this now and laugh. But at the time I was sad, confused, and, when it finally dawned on me, distraught.

Now, we know how the story ended. Jordan came back and the Bulls went on to win three more championships. I have equally vivid memories of those amazing Bulls playoff games from around this time of year in 1996, 1997, 1998. And the joy of the memories from those subsequent wins far outweighs the grief from the news of the retirement.

I'm writing this all tongue-in-cheek. This is, as you might guess, a metaphor for the experience of the *Ascension* that we celebrate today. Christ "retired" from the earth. The apostles were sad, confused, and distraught. The angel even needs to tell them to stop looking up at the sky and move on.

But the grief from the Ascension did not last long. "I'm back" came as they returned to Jerusalem: "[they] returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and they were continually in the temple praising God" (Luke 24:53). And then again at Pentecost (though this is where the Jordan metaphor breaks down, as the third return to the Wizards was not joyful). And then again with the spread of the church. And again and again.

In the spiritual life, grief and confusion almost always gives way to joy and holiness. We just have to be sure we pray through our grief.



Happy Memorial Day. God bless all the men and women who gave their lives in service of our nation and of

freedom. And God bless all of our veterans and those who presently serve in our armed forces, as well as all of our first responders. You are loved and appreciated.

Please note, this weekend, May 28/29, due to Memorial Day weekend, there will be **no HFC Masses** on Saturday 4:30pm and Sunday 10:30am. On Memorial Day itself, Monday, May 30th, there will be just one Mass at 8:30am (no 6:25am Mass). There will be **no Monday Evening of Prayer this Monday nor throughout the rest of the summer.** But I encourage you all to maintain your Monday evening spiritual disciplines in our Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration Chapel! Next Monday, June 6th, at 7:30pm in the church, there will, however, be a special concert performed by the St. John's Boys Choir. We are privileged they are making a pit-stop at our parish throughout their worldwide tour!

This is a big week for the **SPC 8th graders.** Tuesday is their dance, Wednesday their memory dinner, and Thursday their graduation Mass. Our prayers and congratulations to you, 8th graders. Well done on your career and when you go on to do great things in life (become president, pope, manager of the Cubs, etc.), remember Saint Paul of the Cross!

Friday, June 3rd is the **SPC School Olympics.** Please note, there will be no parking in the main SPC lot that day due to this school event. And that Friday evening is the **Young Adult Gathering** at 6pm in the Kinane Center, hosted by Martin our seminarian.

Thank you to all who participated in, and planned for, the **Ukraine Prayer Service** we held last week. We can't always make sense of evil in the world, but we do know our Lord cares and will somehow bring grace into the situation.

Reflections from our Seminararians and Staff



Two weeks ago, Cardinal Cupich ordained my 4 classmates and I as transitional deacons to serve in the Archdiocese of Chicago as we prepare for priesthood. At ordination, a deacon makes several promises; to each of these questions, he responds, "I do":

- Do you resolve to be consecrated for the ministry of the Church through the laying on of hands and the gift of the Holy Spirit?
- ... to discharge with humble charity the office of the Diaconate, so as to assist the priestly Order and to benefit the Christian people?
- ... to hold fast to the mystery of the faith with a clear conscience and to proclaim this faith by word and deed according to the Gospel and the Church's tradition?
- ... to keep the commitment of the celibate state perpetually as a sign of the dedication of your life to Christ the Lord for the sake of the Kingdom of Heaven, in service to God and others?
- ... to guard and increase the spirit of prayer proper to your way of life and to celebrate faithfully the Liturgy of the Hours with and for the People of God and the whole world?
- ... to conform your manner of life always to the example of Christ, whose Body and Blood you will handle at the altar?
- Do you promise respect and obedience to [the bishop] and [his] successors?

Seminary formation helps us to be able to answer all these questions honestly and truthfully. Anyone married was asked similar questions on their wedding day. These vows are not restrictive, but freeing. Without knowing what life will bring, these promises allow us to love in a way that imitates the intensity and faithfulness of Christ's love for the Church.

Like the apostles at the Ascension, all new priests and deacons have a mixture of excitement, nervousness, and a new sense of mission, just as "they returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and they were continually in the temple praising God."

The feast of the ascension is a reminder to us of the coming again of Christ to bring salvation to all who believe. When I was reflecting on this day and its meaning for us, I began thinking about the event described in scripture and the preparation which Christ undertook with His

disciples. This week's readings tell us something about the end of Christ's physical presence in this world. During the weeks since Easter, the readings have described things that Christ shared with his apostles and disciples to prepare them for a time that he would no longer be with them. In his appearances among them, he showed them the signs of his death and resurrection. He reiterated that he was the messiah who came to forgive their sins. He spoke with them repeatedly about the meaning of the Kingdom of God. They listened but didn't really understand as we see in today's reading from the Acts of the apostles — they ask if he will restore the Kingdom in Israel. He encouraged them to stay together until the spirit would come upon them. He described their role in spreading the gospel through their words and actions. In Hebrews, we are reminded that Christ came for the forgiveness of sin, but he will come again to bring salvation to "those who eagerly await him." That was his message to the apostles and disciples as he departed and that is his message to us.

We have had the opportunity to better understand the message of Christ through the celebrations of the Easter season. We also have had numerous opportunities to reawaken our beliefs and actions through liturgies, receipt of the sacraments, and scripture readings and reflections. The most important aspect of this experience is to practice and then share without hesitation. In our faith, we need to keep revisiting his message. The world appears hungry for Christ's message of love. We now are freshly prepared in spirit to share that message with all we encounter. Don't be afraid or feel awkward about his opportunity because next Sunday as we celebrate the feast of Pentecost, we are reminded that the spirit is with us and among us every day.






PHOTO CAPTIONS:

1. The Grand Army of the Republic monument is one of the historic features on the cemetery grounds at Maine Township Cemetery. The monument was installed in the late 1800s as a tribute to the Civil War vets who would be interred on the grounds after the monument was erected. Thanks to Paul Adlaf for his research.

"In honor and memory of these heroes who lost their lives on the battlefields in France, a monument was erected by the Polish-American mothers and fathers of the Gold Star Society, who have for the past several years collected funds for this monument. This monument was consecrated and unveiled on July 4, 1928, at Saint Adalbert cemetery in Nilis, Illinois by His Eminence, Cardinal George Mundelein, who also donated the foundation for the monument, which cost about one thousand dollars."
