Letter from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

This is such an interesting scene with Jesus and his disciples. Our Lord is rejected by a Samaritan town and my boys, James and John (I'm named after James so I always take note of his actions in the Gospels), ask the Lord if they can send down fire to destroy the town. Jesus says, "Yeah, sure, let's burn it down."

No, no. Just want to be sure you're paying attention. That's *not* what Jesus says.

There's precedent for things being destroyed by fire in the Old Testament. Sodom and Gomorrah, of course, were destroyed by fire. The golden calf that the Israelites crafted while Moses was atop Mount Sinai in disobedience to God was smelted down by fire. And Elijah destroyed with divine fire several divisions of soldiers who were trying to capture him while he was praying atop a mountain.

But Jesus is not like this. Not that he's okay with being rejected, but that there's no time to look to this Samaritan village and do this deed. Jesus is on a mission. He has to go to Jerusalem. He has to go there to die. Jerusalem is his focus; not the Samaritan village.

When our Lord rebukes the disciples for their proposal, he's essentially telling them they need to stay focused too. *Don't worry about that village. Keep following me to Jerusalem.* It's the same spirit behind him telling the young man not to bury his father or the other to say farewell to his home.

Jesus is our focus. He is our goal and mission. There will be a lot of encounters in our life that try to take us away from the Lord; inconveniences and even crosses we face while we journey to Jesus. We'll want to "rain fire" down on our spouse for that nasty comment, our child for not listening to us, our boss for his actions, our priest for his (you name it). Just let it go. Stay focused on Jesus. The reward of following him will be much greater than having destroyed your opponent with fire. Sometimes it's what we *don't do* that makes us holy.



Let me start by **thanking** everyone who "took care of

business" while I was away on retreat last week. I'm particularly grateful to Father Nick, who, among other things, covered some funerals and sick calls and also set up for Father Dan Smilanic, who celebrated a few daily Masses during that time. And thank you to the staff. Everything seemed to be great while I was away – I should go on retreat more often!

But seriously, it was a very blessed time of **retreat**. I was with the Cistercian Trappist monks at New Melleray Abbey in Iowa, rising at 3:30am to begin prayer, praying then throughout the day, and otherwise existing in silence and contemplation. I read all the notes and intentions you all left for me, and held you and your intentions in prayer throughout the retreat. And for those who weren't able to write notes, but need prayers (or your loved ones need prayers), I prayed for you too. The notes were very thoughtful and you all show your tremendous faith in God and your devotion to one another. I am privileged to be a priest and to be your pastor.

As I mentioned last week, Father Nick and I, along with all priests of the Archdiocese of Chicago, will be away this Tuesday through Thursday, June 28-30, on the **Priest Convocation**. This is an event required for all of us that happens once every three years. There are talks, including a keynote by Cardinal Wilton Gregory, and time for prayer and fraternity. Because all priests are to be present together, and we stay away from the parish, all parishes replaced Masses with communion services those three days. *So, we will not have Mass Tuesday through Thursday this week.* We will have, instead, a communion service those three days at 8:30am. I'm sorry we will not be present to celebrate Mass, but please know of our prayers and our own intentions for yours while we celebrate Mass together offsite.

This Friday, July 1st is the **Eagle Scout Court of Honor** for the SPC Boy Scout Troop 24. Seven young men will be receiving the highest rank of Eagle Scout: Giancarlo Donahue, Stephen Kuhlman, Michael Lattanzio, Letterio Montalbano, Bradley Orzada, Anthony Purciarello, and PJ Spagnolo. Congratulations, young men, and congrats also to the entire troop, the leaders and Scout Masters.

Reflections from our Seminararians and Staff



Movies are full of instances of self-sacrifice. Harry Stamper in *Armageddon*, T-800 in *Terminator 2: Judgment Day*, and Boromir in *The Fellowship of the Ring*, to name a few, all willfully choose to give up their own lives for another. They recognize some cause greater than themselves that they give all to ensure that it comes to completion. None of

these come close as a perfect analogy to Jesus Christ, but they can point to the nature of sacrifice. When we see it in our lives, we can set ourselves toward it like Jesus does towards Jerusalem.

Perhaps you've been watching the new *Kenobi* show. I think Obi-Wan Kenobi's sacrifice in *Star Wars* is one of the best examples. After watching over Luke Skywalker on a distant planet and guiding him on his quest towards finding his place in the galaxy, Kenobi finds himself fighting with his former pupil, Darth Vader. He remarks that Vader cannot defeat him, warning him, "If you strike me down, I shall become more powerful than you can possibly imagine." Not only is he defending Luke and his friends as they escape, but he will continue as a teacher after he dies. He eventually allows Vader to kill him so that Luke can be free and eventually strengthened.

There is, however, a major difference between Kenobi and Christ, besides the obvious lack of divinity in the former. Obi-Wan, appearing as a Force ghost, tells Luke that the only way he can complete his Jedi training is to strike down and kill the evil that is Darth Vader. He sees Vader as irredeemable, that the man he was before was killed by Vader and the dark side of the Force. Jesus, on the other hand, spends extended time among the broken and marginalized. He does not seek vengeance, even when full villages reject him. Belief in this redemption is essential. Sacrifice is a beautiful thing, but its true value is seen when we believe that redemption is possible. It's then that we can participate in sacrifice and salvation, and we point people to the One who offers it.

Someone asked me recently to consider writing about the sacrament of reconciliation. We are fortunate here at St. Paul to offer the sacrament on all weekday mornings and Saturday evening. Part of the reason we exist is to extend the sacramental grace God desires to bestow on his people to help them. Many people fret at the thought of such vulnerability before the church's minister or might rather avoid the discomfort of self-reflection. Whatever the reason, it should not deprive one of the mercy God desires to bestow on his beloved children.

It would be better to arouse a thirst for the life giving water Christ wants to give; think of his encounter with the woman at the well. He wanted to approach the truth with her so she may invite in his healing grace and thereby transform her life from one of hiding on the margins to evangelizing smack in the heart of the city. God can do amazing things if only we would let him in to work on our hearts. The first step then is to ask God to reveal the truth about our shortcomings; their exposure is only so progress can be made to grow in holiness. Wait no longer; resolve to approach the confessional. A searching and fearless inventory will allow the penitent to be well prepared. Any good confession takes humility and honesty to populate the list.

Looking at the list, our heart should move to some degree of contrition, we are not happy with what we see and ultimately want to achieve a greater comfort with a life of virtue, or at least be able to prefer it to the tumultuous life of vice and regret. Why not write out that list, leave nothing off; the sacred seal of confession binds the priest to secrecy with no exception. A wave of relief being completely honest can be refreshing. The priest being a fellow sinner if he has any sense will be compassionate and exhort you to some measures to strive for improvement with the help of God. Moreover, once you receive absolution and finish your penance, recognizing that God's love for you is fierce will be just the right ingredient to begin experiencing true peace.







111th ANNIVERSARY




