





## Letter from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

New Melleray Trappist Abbey, where I was on retreat a couple weeks ago, is somewhat out in the country. Once a day I would try to get some exercise and would go walking or running through the countryside. The rolling hills allowed me to see for miles and miles, and there was

nothing but beautiful farmland. I ran through these long, straight roads that cut through the acres beyond acres of corn and soy crops, and I thought to myself, "this is how we are able to feed the earth's population." The land gave me a great appreciation for our creation and how God has blessed us. There won't be a shortage of food. These crops, which I was running through, will go to feed us, or feed animals that will feed us, or go to make machines and technology that will feed us.

Remember from *Corpus Christi* a few weeks ago when Moses wonders to God how he's going to feed the 600,000 Israelites in the desert? "But Moses said, 'The people around me include six hundred thousand soldiers; yet you say, 'I will give them meat to eat for a whole month.' Can enough sheep and cattle be slaughtered for them? If all the fish of the sea were caught, would they have enough?' The Lord answered Moses, 'Is this beyond the Lord's reach? You shall see now whether or not what I have promised you takes place'" (Numbers 11:21-23).

God provided. We have billions of "Israelites" in the desert today. God will provide. He is providing through this land and our ability to cultivate it.


But then there was one point when I was running through the fields I heard, actually, Jesus speak today's line from the Gospel: "the harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest" (Luke 10:2).

Yes, the harvest is (or will be) abundant. But will we be able to gather it in?

Literally this is a question to ask ourselves today. Food prices are increasing. Farming is becoming difficult.

Spiritually this is a question to ask ourselves today. Do we have "laborers" to bring in the "harvest"?

Yes, we need priests and consecrated women and men to help souls encounter Christ. We need you all as well to help with the harvest. One way you can help – one way you can be a 'laborer' – is to pray. Think of a family member or another person and, when you sit down to pray, bring them into your heart. Perhaps recall their struggles and their blessings, see them as God sees them and love them, and then, once they're in your heart, lift your heart with them in it to God the Father. He will receive you and that individual. This is one way we can bring in the harvest to feed the starving earth.



Are you looking to be more involved in service in connection to your faith? Perhaps God might be calling you to be a **bereavement minister, wedding coordinator, or minister of care to the sick**. We have wonderful bereavement (coordinated by Margaret Teich), wedding (coordinated by Joyce Johnson), and minister of care (coordinated by Joanne Stewart) ministries here at Saint Paul. Thank you, Margaret, Joyce and Joanne, as well as Adrienne Timm, for all your work in providing these services for our parish. We are in need of more volunteers. Bereavement ministers work with the family in planning the funeral, wedding coordinators with the bride and groom in the wedding rehearsal and wedding ceremony, and the ministers of care bring Communion to people at nursing homes, hospitals, etc. Please spend some time in prayer if this is something you would find fruitful, for we sure could you use your help. ## Reflections from our Seminararians and Staff



While at the University of Wyoming, I was living “freely:” I took time off to go hiking, I improved my country western swing dancing skills, and rode horses a few times. I even grew out my hair for a couple years and embraced the stares as I rocked out to “Rebel Rebel” by David Bowie on the baseball field during our pre-game warmups. I was a

free man!

But was I truly free? Enjoying things like wilderness exploration and country dances are not bad in and of themselves, but when the focus is on *me* without any room for God’s presence in my life, that’s when things go wrong: *I* was concentrated on *my* desires, doing what *I* wanted to do, and doing it right now, because *I* was free.

Jesus offers a refreshing perspective on liberty, that we are truly free only when our primary emphasis is on God. This week’s responsorial psalm (#65) describes this focus beautifully: “Cry out with joy to *God*... render *Him* glorious praise... tremendous *His* deeds among men.” When our heart, mind, and soul are each deeply rooted first and foremost in God and receiving His love for us, this leads to a deep, personal communion with the Lord that He desires to have with each of us. Furthermore, this relationship with God leads to joy because we know Jesus is ultimately in control, and He always wants what’s best for us, as Psalm 65:6 says for this Sunday: “Let our joy then be in Him, for he rules by His might.”

Fr. Jacques Philippe also summarizes these teachings well in his book [Interior Freedom](#). He writes that St. Thérèse of Lisieux had freedom because she “loves intensely,” which led to her holiness. He then quoted St. Maria Faustina, who said “The love of God sets the soul free.” In his Fr. Jacques’s own words, “If we loved more, love would give our lives infinite dimensions.” As we celebrate our nation’s independence this week, I think that interior freedom is something we all desire.

But there is another tenet even more important that seems to get foggier as time passes. We are a nation *under God*, and herein lies the potential for true freedom. Freedom is not a license to do whatever we want; it is the enhanced capacity to choose that which enriches our authentic humanity. It is the self-conscious choice of the good, an option for the ultimate good, the Lord. Without this understanding, the very things we pursue ultimately enslave us. As Johann Wolfgang von Goethe once said, “None are more hopelessly enslaved than those who falsely believe they are free.”

May we experience the true joy of freedom in even more profound ways as we shed the grip of this world and draw closer to our Lord.



## Statement from Cardinal Blase Cupich

### STATEMENT OF CARDINAL BLASE J. CUPICH, ARCHBISHOP OF CHICAGO ON THE SUPREME COURT'S DECISION IN *DOBBS V. JACKSON WOMEN'S HEALTH ORGANIZATION*

Today, the U.S. Supreme Court issued its ruling in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, which overturns the court's tragic 1973 decision that removed legal protection for unborn children. We welcome this important ruling and the opportunity it creates for a national conversation on protecting human life in the womb and promoting human dignity at all stages of life. This moment should serve as a turning point in our dialogue about the place an unborn child holds in our nation, about our responsibility to listen to women and support them through pregnancies and after the birth of their children, and about the need to refocus our national priorities to support families, particularly those in need.

The Catholic Church brings to such a conversation the conviction that every human life is sacred, that every person is made in the image and likeness of God and therefore deserving of reverence and protection. That belief is the reason the Catholic Church is the country's largest provider of social services, many aimed at eliminating the systemic poverty and health care insecurity that trap families in a cycle of hopelessness and limit authentic choice.

We also come to this dialogue as Americans, knowing that the principle that all human beings are endowed by the Creator with certain inalienable rights is enshrined in the Declaration of Independence, and that first among these is the right to life.

Make no mistake, because this ruling regrettably will have little impact on abortion in Illinois, as there are virtually no restrictions here, we will continue to advocate strongly for legal protections for unborn children. And we will redouble our efforts to work with all to build a culture that values the inalienable rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness for all.

This ruling is not the end of a journey, but rather a fresh start. It underscores the need to understand those who disagree with us, and to inculcate an ethic of dialogue and cooperation. Let us begin by examining our national conscience, taking stock of those dark places in our society and in our hearts that turn to violence and deny the humanity of our brothers and sisters, and get to work building up the common good by choosing life.







Enjoy these three heavenly views of Saint Paul of the Cross from the 1930s to present day. They give you an idea how our parish has grown.

3. A google satellite view of our campus in 2018 provided by a vendor working on a project








