



# Letter from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

"Raise your eyes and look about," says Isaiah in our first reading today, "they all gather and come to you."

On this Feast of the Epiphany, we recall the baby Jesus being visited by the three magi. These men from the east who were not Jewish were eager to see the child. They gave their treasures as gifts. Imagine giving away the treasures you hold dearly – family heirlooms, your 401K, Bears season tickets – to another family. It would indicate just how much you love that family and their baby. The three wise men were absolutely devoted to Christ.

We stir up within ourselves on this feast day a desire to be similarly devoted to Jesus. Go to whatever lengths to see him and spend time with him. Give away your desires and treasures. Lay those at the foot of the crib as your gifts. Commit yourself to doing his will (and his will is to love him with our whole heart and love our neighbor).

Someone mentioned in our scripture seminar a few weeks ago that hundreds of people were lined up outside of a CosMcs, waiting for hours, to try the new cafe. Then someone else asked, 'would these same people do the same to see Christ?' Epiphany is about setting our priorities. Christ will fill us much more than a spiced latte.

But I also want to make another point about the

Epiphany. Yes, we "raise our eyes" to Christ and "come to him," as Isaiah says. But Christ does the same for us. As I mentioned on Christmas, Christ is so generous that he makes Christmas our birthdays as well as his. This is why, I think, we love Christmas so much and receive gifts. Well, if the Epiphany is about adoration, then we can feel confident on this day that Jesus adores us as much as we adore him.

Just as a mother and father watch and pay close attention to their newborn child, so too Christ pays close attention to us. When a baby cries, the parents care for the child. The parents stay up awake all night for the child's sake. When the baby soils its diaper, the parents don't condemn or scorn the child. They delight in the child. They are proud of their child and even give it gifts.

We are adults now and our parents no longer do this for us to the same extent. God does it for us. He watches us, comforts us, gives us what we need, takes pride in us, doesn't condemn us, and shows us off to the angels and saints.

Let this reality give you comfort. Let this truth deepen your love for God.

I hope you all had a wonderful holiday break. **Saint Paul of the Cross school returns** this Tuesday, January 9th. All the best to our religious education students and college students returning to school as well.

A friendly reminder that the **Wednesday morning Scripture Seminar** will *not* take place this week. We will resume on Wednesday, January 24th.

Also, please note, next Sunday, January 14th there will not be a **Family Mass** at 10:30am in the Holy Family Chapel. We will resume next month, Sunday, February 11th.

# Community Reflections



"Why did Saint Paul travel so far to spread the Gospel?"

This question came up during our pilgrimage last month when my seminary classmates and I had the opportunity to visit different sites in Turkey, Greece, and Italy where Saint Paul preached the Good News of Jesus Christ's death and

resurrection to save all humanity. It was a huge privilege to pray in different churches, put our hands on the marble roads of Ephesus and Corinth where Saint Paul walked, and eventually see his tomb in Rome. However, Saint Paul traveled *thousands* of more miles, without pay, all on foot or via ship, and was even nearly stoned to death for telling people about Jesus (see Acts 14:19-20), yet continued to spread the Gospel. What possibly compelled him to continue?

After his conversion (Acts 9:1-19), I imagine Saint Paul developed an incredibly deep prayer life that drew him closer to God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. That encounter with Jesus changed the entire course of Saint Paul's life. Saint Paul's experience has shown me that we encounter Jesus daily, which can inspire us to be more devoted to God. Every time we talk with a co-worker, take care of our spouse or child, or offer an encouraging word or a smile to a person experiencing homelessness, those are ways in which we encounter Jesus. Even more specifically, we encounter Jesus in the Eucharist: the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ. That true presence of Jesus in the Eucharist provides the love and fulfillment we all long for, reminiscent of Saint Augustine's quote: "Our hearts are restless until they rest in God."

In 2 Corinthians 5:14, Saint Paul wrote "the love of Christ compels us," showing that he was inspired to devote his life to spread the Gospel because He felt God's love, and loved God with a grateful heart in return. May Saint Paul and Mary, the Mother of God and our greatest role model for loving Jesus, inspire us to serve the Lord, love our neighbor, and receive God's love for us more deeply each day.

Our Adoration Chapel is open from 5 am until 11 pm.





# WHAT DID MICE HAVE TO DO WITH RESERVING THE EUCHARIST?


From EWTN, "Certainly by the 800's, the Blessed Sacrament was kept within the monastic church itself, close to the altar. In fact, we have a poem from the year 802, telling of a pyx containing the Sacred Species reserved on the high altar of the abbey church at Lindisfarne in England.

The practice of reserving the Eucharist in religious houses was so universal that there is no evidence to the contrary even before the year 1000. In fact, numerous regulations are extant which provided for protection of the sacred elements, as the wording went, "from profanation by mice and impious men." The species were to be kept under lock and key and sometimes in a receptacle raised high enough to be out of easy reach of profaning hands.

It is interesting to note that one of the first unmistakable references to reserving the Blessed Sacrament is found in a life of St. Basil (who died in 379). Basil is said to have divided the Eucharistic Bread into three parts when he celebrated Mass in the monastery. One part he consumed, the second part he gave to the monks, and the third he placed in a golden dove suspended over the altar.

This would suggest that, though we have less access to Oriental sources, the Eastern monasteries were centuries ahead of the West in reserving the Eucharistic elements in the monastic church proper and not only in a separate place."

Stay tuned for our next message which will discuss a non-believer in the true presence of the Eucharist and how God used that non-belief to fuel a deeper devotion and belief in the true presence. God bless!

# Fr. James' Christmas Reflections



# January 7 - Saint Raymond of Penafort

"When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine'." John 2:2

I celebrated two weddings on New Years Eve one year and both wedding couples chose today's Gospel reading, the Wedding Feast at Cana, as their wedding Gospel. A fitting choice.

The wine will run out. It is an inevitable reality in marriage, priesthood, family life, the spiritual life, your career, whatever. What once was exciting and joyous becomes flat, boring, and even painful. It is no one's fault the wine runs out. The very fact that Jesus had this situation as his first miracle is testament that honeymoons end naturally.

When the proverbial wine runs out in our vocation the advice is not to go in search of another party or to replace the wine with something else, but to turn to Jesus.

We might not always know the wine has run out. The bridegroom was oblivious to the situation. Spending some time with Mary will help us see the state of our cellar. She will tell us if we are dry, and she will tell us what to do. There is no selfishness in asking the Lord to give us new wine in our vocation. It will benefit the party. And the wine will be better than it was to start.

Prayer: Lord, I have water, but I want wine. The wine has run out in my marriage, in my career, in my city, in my prayer, in my life. You want me to have wine. You want me to have joy. I turn my cup over so you can fill it. I praise you for this gift.



#### The Baptism of the Lord

"Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness."

Matthew 3:15

I recall having a mixed reaction when I was told in adolescence that I needed to take a shower. Typically, it occurred in the kitchen around dinnertime, having returned from a sports practice. Part of me was offended at being told I was unpleasant to be around. The other part of me was encouraged, for I knew there was a quick and guaranteed solution to the problem and that it was only something superficial holding me back from being admitted to my family's presence.

Jesus was baptized not to be made clean, as I needed to be after a football practice. Jesus was baptized to establish the quick and easy way to be made clean. He was baptized to make original sin something superficial and easily removed.

We don't like to talk about original sin, and we don't like to imagine an innocent baby having it. But all it takes is a simple pouring of water with a one-sentence formula to remove the thing. The baby is pristine.

The invitation here is not to focus on the sin and its consequences, but rather on the simple means of cleansing and communion. Our Lord made it that easy for us. Original sin could have been the worst calamity for humanity. Now it is the easiest disease cured and something to never be thought about again.

Prayer: Jesus, I think about original sin as a theory, but I never consider it applying to myself. I suppose all my sins are from the root of that original sin. Which means the formula for being cleansed of these sins is just as easy. I'm sorry for what I've done and for the loving person I haven't been able to be for others. Please help me grow this year to be like you: kind, compassionate, humble, and sacrificial.
