



Letter from a Pastor to his People



Dear Parishioners,

John the Baptist pointed to Jesus walking by and said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." This wasn't the first time John the Baptist had done this. He said the exact same thing the previous day. The first time nothing happened. The second time, John's disciples, Andrew and John, left the Baptist

and followed Jesus. It was like Andrew and John understood now what the Baptist, their mentor, was saying. The Lamb of God was the one they were to follow. Being a disciple of John the Baptist was like being in the minor leagues. Not bad, but not the ultimate goal.

Andrew and John were able to achieve their ultimate goal because they were open and prayerful. Again, they didn't "get it" right away on the first day. But they took what John the Baptist said to heart. They prayed about this Jesus figure. They pondered what "Lamb of God" meant. Why, of all the titles he could have used, would the Baptist use *Lamb of God?* Because, there is something about offering and sacrifice in the nature of Jesus and in being a disciple. Andrew and John realized, after a period of reflection, that they were drawn to this life of self-giving. It was a risk, but prayer gave them the courage to heed the calling.

So, being a prayerful, reflective individual who is open to anything will allow us to find our calling and live the most joyful life possible.

Let's not forget about John the Baptist, who shows great wisdom and holiness here. He lets his disciples go. He realizes his objective isn't to have disciples, but to lead others to Christ. It isn't easy to let go of fame and success, and so John shows incredible humility and charity. We are all called to be like John the Baptist – don't keep things for yourself. Give them away. Attract people so you can point them to Christ.

John the Baptist would have been proud of his disciples, Andrew and John. They end up doing what the Baptist did. Once Andrew and John fall in love with Jesus – it only takes an afternoon – they find their brothers and point them to Jesus. Peter and James will fall in love with Jesus and then do the same, pointing others to Jesus and making disciples. Holiness begets

holiness.

May the family of discipleship grow.



Community Reflections



When growing up, I remember branching out into our neighborhood visiting, playing, and doing projects or homework with friends. My mother had a couple of recognizable techniques to call us home from these activities. Call on the landline phone, or if we were in the neighborhood, use a school bell to ring us home. When I got married and had children. I

discovered that my wife had learned to make a loud whistle with her fingers in her lips. It was distinctive and the sound certainly carried farther than a bell.

In each of these examples the summons interfered with whatever we were doing. The source of the call was well known to us - parent calling. The medium used was also distinctive and known by both parties. Lastly, the message was understood - come home, period.

In today's readings, we hear paging like those used by parents. In the first reading we hear Samuel who is asleep and hears his name called. He thinks its Eli calling him and He runs to Eli three times and asks, "You called me?" Eli ultimately tells him to respond to God, "Speak, for your servant is listening."

When we read the gospel, we hear the story of Jesus beginning his public life and recruiting the apostles. We learn that Andrew and John learn who Christ is when John the Baptist points him out to them. They then followed this stranger. "What are you looking for?" Jesus asks these two new followers. "We are looking to be with you, Teacher, Rabbi. Where are you staying?" After spending the day with Jesus where he was staying, one of these men, Andrew, was so convinced who Christ was that he found his brother Simon and brought him to Jesus. Like Andrew we become a believer after spending some time with Jesus. Or alternately, we search for God and come up feeling empty. The mystics like Mother Teresa spoke about recovering from the dark night of the soul.

Today we pray to God that we can know when he is calling to us, and then going to that place, those places, where He dwells. Like in our childhood, a call from wherever we are and from whatever we are doing, to our home.

Our Adoration Chapel is open from 5 am until 11 pm.





Message from Adoration Team

DID ALL CATHOLICS BELIEVE IN THE TRUE PRESENCE OF JESUS IN THE EUCHARIST?

From EWTN, "Toward the end of the eleventh century we enter into a new era in the history of Eucharistic adoration. Until then, the Real Presence was taken for granted in Catholic belief and its reservation was the common practice in Catholic churches, including the chapels and oratories of religious communities. Suddenly a revolution hit the Church when Berengarius (999-1088), archdeacon of Angers in France, publicly denied that Christ was really and physically present under the species of bread and wine. Others took up the idea and began writing about the Eucharistic Christ as not exactly the Christ of the Gospels or, by implication, as not actually there.

The matter became so serious that Pope Gregory VII ordered Berengarius to sign a retraction. This credo has made theological history. It was the Church's first definitive statement of what had always been believed and never seriously challenged. The witness came from the abbotbecome-pope, whose faith in the Blessed Sacrament had been nourished for years in a Benedictine monastery."



The Holy Family Chapel has been the predominant place of worship for our family since 1988. We are grateful for the informal atmosphere where we felt that our child(ren)'s need for a little movement would not be disruptive to the people around us. We enjoyed that the readings and homilies as well as gathering around the altar for the "Our Father" were geared to engage the children. The addition of the library books was also welcomed. The occasional donuts, juice and coffee and after Mass fellowship strengthened the bonds of the families who regularly attended the Masses.

Our eldest son's first Holy Communion was celebrated in the Holy Family Chapel along with 3 other classmates. We enjoyed the setting and atmosphere to experience the reception of the Eucharist with our extended family.

We witnessed the expansion of masses in the HFC from the single 9:30 Mass to the now scheduled 9:00, 10:30 Sunday Masses and 4:30 Saturday Mass. The introduction of the 10:30 Sunday Mass also was the start of allowing the children to participate more fully in the celebration of the Mass by doing readings, reciting the petitions and ushering. The children felt proud because, just like the adults, they had important roles to play in the Liturgy.

Over the years we have met a lot of interesting people who shared our interests and likewise enjoyed the family atmosphere of the Holy Family Chapel. One particularly memorable person was Jerry Ryan, who we feel personified the spirit of the Holy Family Chapel. His regular seat was in the back row of the center section of the Chapel at 10:30 Down. He warmly greeted all by name and expressed interest in their families. As we got to know him, we discovered his role in the founding of the Irish Rovers and his service in the Navy. It became clear why some addressed him as "Commander".

We were proud to have the opportunity to help with the HFC redecorating a few years ago. It was another opportunity to work with other HFC families in enhancing our worship space.

Congratulations on this the 20th Anniversary of the Holy Family Chapel to everyone who has contributed to making our worship experience and environment what it is today – a true "family liturgy".

We began attending in 1979 when we moved to Park Ridge and raised our family attending mass in the Holy Family Chapel.


We were active in the liturgy committee during the 1980s and 1990s, and helped with the renovation of the chapel. We began relationships with other families like us, and have remained close friends.


